# 5. <u>FY 2022-2045 YMPO Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Amendment</u> #1 and Air Quality Conformity Status Update

The consultant Kittleson and Associates continues to work on the FY 2022-2045 YMPO LRTP Amendment #1 and Air Quality Conformity update for Yuma County, City of Yuma, and ADOT projects after receiving feedback from the Interagency Council (IAC).

After YMPO was informed by Environmental Public Agency (EPA) that YMPO 2007 emissions budget was withdrawn on June 16, 2022, and cannot be used. The consultant has been working on conducting a build/no build interim budget test for each analysis year for conformity purposes. A revised draft will be sent to the Interagency Consultation (IAC) for review of the conformity determination. YMPO staff will provide an update and revised anticipated timeline for completion and final approval.

# 6. <u>FY 2022-26 YMPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment</u> #11

The FY 2022-26 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 29, 2021, and has since been amended ten times, most recently on August 24, 2023. During the review of the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Amendment #1, YMPO was informed by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) that an Air Quality Conformity Analys was not done for the most recently adopted FY2024-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) approved by the YMPO Executive Board on June 29, 2023.

FHWA recommended moving all the projects from the FY2024-2028 TIP to the

previously adopted FY2022-2026 TIP with air conforming status by FHWA.

This item is on the agenda for information, discussion, and possible actions:

- (1) To recommend rescinding the motion approved on June 29, 2023, by the Board, of the YMPO FY 2024-28 TIP, Resolution #155, and subsequent amendments thereafter (#1 and #2) of the FY 2024-28 TIP adoption.
- (2) To recommend approval of the YMPO FY 2022-26 TIP Amendment #11 to the Executive Board.

Mr. Villegas will present this item and further information is contained in an information summary as Item 6.

# 7. Off-System Bridge (OSB) Call for Projects

ADOT issued a formal call for projects for the Off-System Bridge (OSB) Program for State FY2025. The purpose of the program is to fund design and/or construction for replacement, rehabilitation, preservation, and protection of roadway bridges over waterways, other topographical barriers, other roadways, railroads, canals, and ferry landings on bridges that are not on the Federal-aid highway system (Local roads and rural minor collectors).

This item is on the agenda as a reminder that the dateline to submit projects is December 30, 2023. No projects have been submitted to YMPO as of today.

# 8. <u>Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Update</u>

The TA program is a 10% set-aside of the Surface Transportation Block Program (STBG) Program established under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL). A call for projects went out in July and the projects were sent to the State Transportation Board for review and approval. The State Transportation Board approved all the YMPO project on November 17, 2023.

# 9. <u>FY 2026-2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan Update</u>

On November 9, 2023, YMPO released the Request for Proposal (RFP) for the FY2026-2050 LRTP Update. The RFP submittals were due no later than 3:00 PM local time on December 7, 2023, and TAC members have received all the submittals for the FY2026-2050 LRTP Update from YMPO.

TAC members were asked to evaluate and rank the proposals by December 12, 2023. One proposal was received, members will have the opportunity to discuss if the proposal met the project requirements outlined in the scope of work and provide a recommendation to the Executive Board.

# 10. <u>Arizona 2024 Safety Performance Projections (Targets)</u>

On August 31, 2023, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) formally established Safety Projections (Targets) for the State of Arizona for 2024. These Safety Projections (Targets) are based on the Safety Performance Measures established by the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Safety Performance Management (Safety PM) final ruling and are based on five year rolling averages.

ADOT requests a letter from YMPO within 180 days of the effective date, August 31, 2023, indicating whether YMPO supports ADOT's SP Projections or identifying YMPO's SP Projections. YMPO has reviewed the TPMs prepared by ADOT, and the TAC may provide a recommendation to the Executive Board after their review.

This item is on the agenda for information, discussion, and possible action to recommend adoption of the Arizona 2024 Performance Projections for approval by the Executive Board. Mr. Villegas will present this item and further information is contained in an information summary as Item 10.

# 11. <u>FY 2024 Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot (DCIP) Program Opportunity</u>

The DCIP Program is a competitive grant program that enables state and local projects to address deficiencies in community infrastructure that support a military installation. Last month, YMPO was notified of the upcoming opportunity for the 2024 grant cycle of the DCIP Grant; the Notice of Funding Opportunity is anticipated to be issued in March 2024. While Congress has yet to finalize the fiscal year 2024 appropriations and authorizations, eligible applicants are encouraged to start drafting their proposals for the DCIP now.

In FY 2022, YMPO, in collaboration with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and support of the YPG commander, pursued a \$13.3 million grant application for US 95 to widen the segment of US-95 from Rifle Range Road to just north of the Wellton-Mohawk Canal. The application was successful, and the project is currently underway.

#### 1. Call to Order and Declaration of Votes

Vice-Chairman Frank Sanchez called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. The city of Yuma declared votes Dave Wostenberg (5 votes) and Frank Sanchez (2 Votes).

# 2. <u>Title VI of the Civil Rights ACT of 1964</u>

The YMPO Title VI Nondiscrimination Notice to the Public was read by YMPO Mobility Manager, JR Aguilar.

#### 3. Call to the Public

There were no announcements from the public or TAC.

# 4. Approval of Minutes

The October 12, 2023, TAC meeting minutes had been included with the agenda. Dave Wostenberg, City of Yuma, moved to approve the minutes and Charles Gutierrez, City of Somerton, seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

# 5. ADOT Urban Boundary Smoothing

YMPO Senior Transportation Planner, Fernando Villegas, introduced Lucas Murray from ADOT Data Analytic Group to present this item. Mr. Murray provided a presentation about the Urban Boundary Smoothing project and a review of the comments and feedback provided by the YMPO region. The previous Urban Boundary Smoothing process occurred in 2013 following the 2010 Census.

Mr. Murray explained the Urban Boundary Smoothing starts off by using data from the US Census 2020 Urban Area Boundary dataset. The census data is designed primarily using housing and population data and may exclude important transportation features from being considered as urban. FHWA allows states to adjust "smooth" boundaries to account for and include these features. The adjusted boundaries are important as they will be used for the next 10 years to determine the urbanicity of a road, which will impact road functional classifications and funding opportunities available based on these classifications.

Mr. Murray explained the effort being requested by FHWA will be used for transportation purposes only and the total amount of money the YMPO region receives will not change, because total YMPO regional funding is based on population. However, what is impacted is where the federalized funding can be allocated, roadways classified as urban minor collectors and above qualify, whereas rural minor collectors don't qualify for federal highway funds.

Mr. Gutierrez asked if the boundaries have been extended to include the housing area west of Somerton. Mr. Murray explained that the area has been extended west to include the housing area.

Mr. Murray asked if the TAC members had any areas they wanted to focus on. Mr. Gutierrez communicated that during the LRTP update there was a discussion on

roads of regional significance and County 19<sup>th</sup> Street and Avenue 3E were both determined to be roads with regional significance. Mr. Gutierrez asked if those roads should be included. Additionally, Mr. Sanchez informed us of proposed development occurring south of County 19<sup>th</sup> Street. Mr. Murray explained that only minor collector roads will be impacted since major collectors are covered in the federal aid program. Mr. Murray asked if the TAC members would like to include the area and Mr. Sanchez informed them that they would like to leave the area as presented.

Mr. Murray presented to the TAC road sections west of Yuma that were not included in the draft Urban Bound Smoothing that are currently minor urban collectors between County 11<sup>th</sup> Street to County 13<sup>th</sup> Street and between Avenue F to Avenue B ½ because there is no development going on in the area. Mr. Murray shared the FHWA recommendation of reclassifying these roads as major collectors.

YMPO Executive Director, Crystal Figueroa, inquired about the areas located northeast in the foothills. Mr. Sanchez explained that right of way exists in the area and that it is possible that Foothills Boulevard will loop and connect with Fortuna Road using one of the identified areas. Mr. Sanchez requested incorporating these two areas into the urban boundary. Mr. Murray requested that Mr. Sanchez draft a brief justification to include these two areas. The justification needs to be sent to FHWA for approval.

# 6. <u>FY 2022-2045 YMPO Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Amendment</u> #1 and Air Quality Conformity Recommendation

YMPO Senior Transportation Planner, Fernando Villegas, introduced Vamshi Yellisetty, from Kittelson & Associates the consultant responsible for the LRTP Amendment #1.

Mr. Yellisetty presented a summary of activities that have been completed for LRTP Amendment #1 and Air Quality Conformity. Mr. Yellisetty informed the TAC members that on October 30, 2023, EPA conveyed to YMPO that the emissions budget used in the FY2022-2026 LRPT is no longer valid and the Air Quality Conformity Analysis conducted for the LRTP amendment is not valid. EPA also informed YMPO that the 2007 emissions budget was withdrawn on June 16, 2022.

Mr. Yellisetty communicated that the EPA had recommended conducting a Build vs No-Build intermediate test for each analysis year of the LRTP. YMPO and Kittelson & Associates reached out to FHWA local office for guidance and YMPO met with FHWA and ADOT to discuss options. During the meeting FHWA informed YMPO that they had not received a request to approve the FY2024-

2028 TIP and that the Air Conformity Analysis had not been done. Mr. Hoffman explained that FHWA was not aware of the FY2024-2028 TIP submission because the STIP had not been submitted for review to FHWA at that time. The STIP has been submitted by ADOT and they identified the current federally approved TIP is the FY2022-2026.

Mr. Yellisetty suggested using the FY2022-2026 TIP and prepare a TIP amendment bringing all the exempt projects into the FY2022-2026 TIP. A second amendment is recommended to bring all non-exempt projects (capacity projects) from the FY2024-2028 TIP into the FY2022-2026 TIP. An air quality conformity analysis will be done for the three projects that will be part of the LRTP amendment #1 and will be sent to IAC for comments and then submitted to FHWA.

Mr. Gutierrez mentioned that the only issue that can potentially happen is a delay in the construction start time for construction projects in the City of Yuma, Yuma County and ADOT. Mr. Sanchez stated that should only affect the projects in FY2007 and FY2028. Mr. Hoffman explained that only the projects that are part of the LRTP Amendment #1 are going to be on hold until the air quality conformity is done for each of those projects.

YMPO Executive Director, Crystal Figueroa, asked the TAC members if they would like to move forward with amending the FY2022-2026 TIP to include exempt projects and then create another amendment to include non-exempt projects that require the Air Quality Conformity Analysis. Mr. Gutierrez agreed with this direction. Mr. Sanchez and Mr. Wostenberg agreed to move forward with the proposed amendments.

# 7. Off-System Bridge (OSB) Call for Projects

YMPO Senior Transportation Planner, Fernando Villegas, introduced David Benton, ADOT State Bridge Engineer to present this item. Mr. Benton gave an overview of the two programs that are available for off-system bridges.

Mr. Benton explained that between now and December 30, 2023, they want MPOs to receive applications from the sponsors. The review process will start in January 2024 and in February 2024 notification of selections will be sent to project sponsors and MPOs. Mr. Benton also explained that the federal funding will be available for FY2025.

Mr. Sanchez asked if ADOT has cost estimates that local agencies can use since design and construction costs have skyrocketed. Mr. Sanchez mentioned that estimates sometimes are not realistic to be able to put together a good application. Mr. Benton explained that the estimates that ADOT has may not be applicable for

local bridges and that he encourages project sponsors to work directly with consultants, and agencies that are familiar with the ADOT process for scoping the project.

# 8. The Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Update

Jeff Heinrichs, YMPO IT Manager/Associate Planner, presented this item.

Mr. Heinrichs informed the TAC member that the three TA projects will be presented for approval to the State Transportation Board on November 17, 2023, and that all the projects have a good chance of being approved.

Mr. Heinrichs also informed the TAC members that it is possible that another call for projects may take place early next year.

Mr. Wostenberg asked if some of the funding will roll over to next year. Mr. Gutierrez said that in the past on other programs funding that wasn't apportioned was used as contingency funds for project cost overruns that occur from the original estimates and he offered that maybe the same would hold true for the TA program.

# 9. <u>FY2024-2028 YMPO Transportation Improvement program (TIP) Amendment</u> #2

Mr. Villegas explained to the TAC members that as they were informed earlier the FY2024-2028 TIP can no longer be used and this proposed amendment probably will be part of the next FY2022-2026 TIP amendment.

# 10. <u>2023 Rural Transportation Summit (AZRTS) Recap</u>

Ms. Figueroa informed the TAC members about the AZRTS summit that was held in October, and the summit was a well-attended conference. Ms. Figueroa communicated that there were approximately 275 registrants, including 12 legislators, as well as elected officials, federal and state staff who attended the summit.

Ms. Figueroa asked if the TAC members had any comments. Mr. Wostenberg mentioned that it was a very successful event and that he was able to meet several representatives, elected officials, FTA and FHWA staff. Mr. Sanchez asked if this was the first time that YMPO allowed agencies to come in and present their projects.

Ms. Figueroa informed the TAC members that when an MPO hosts a conference there is an opportunity to highlight the region and Mr. Gutierrez had the idea to include area cities and town, so that they would have an opportunity to display area projects. Mr. Gutierrez mentioned that he hopes future transportation summits continue with the practice of including area municipalities as an opportunity for

them to communicate directly with legislators and elected officials that come by the tables.

# 11. FY2026-2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan Update

Mr. Villegas informed the TAC members that the Request For Proposal (RFP) to the update the FY2026-2050 LRTP was released on November 9, 2023. Consultants will have until December 7, 2023, to submit their proposals to YMPO. Mr. Villegas, stated that the TAC members can form a sub-committee or all the TAC members can review the proposals by December 18, 2023.

Mr. Villegas also explained that during a special meeting on January 4. 2023 the Executive Board will review and select a consultant. He communicated that a draft LRTP will be due on April 28, 2025, and the final report needs to be provided no later than June 26, 2025.

Ms. Figueroa told the TAC members that on December 7, 2023, after the submittal deadline the proposals will be delivered to each TAC members office. Mr. Sanchez asked if a sub-committee needs to be formed or not and TAC members agreed that all TAC members should be part of the review team.

Status Update

### **SUMMARY:**

The YMPO 2022-2045 YMPO LRTP was initially approved on July 29, 2021. The consultant Kittelson & Associates continues to work on the FY 2022-2045 YMPO LRTP Amendment #1 and Air Quality Conformity update for Yuma County, City of Yuma, and ADOT projects after receiving feedback from the Interagency Council (IAC).

After YMPO was informed by Environmental Public Agency (EPA) that YMPO 2007 emissions budget was withdrawn on June 16, 2022, and cannot be used. The consultant has been working on conducting a build/no build interim budget test for each analysis year for conformity purposes. This analysis requires a larger effort by the consultant. YMPO staff provided the consultant a list of completed projects, roadway projects under construction, and new roadways in the YMPO area for the build/no build interim budget test.

A revised draft will be sent to the Interagency Consultation (IAC) for review of the conformity determination on December 11, 2023.

Below is an anticipated timeline for completion and final approval of the YMPO 2022-2045 YMPO LRTP Amendment #1 and Air Quality Conformity Update.

**SUBJECT:** FY 2022-26 YMPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), – Amendment #11.

#### SUMMARY:

The FY 2022-26 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 29, 2021, and has since been amended ten times, most recently on August 24, 2023. During the review of the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Amendment #1, YMPO was informed by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) that an Air Quality Conformity Analysis was not done for the most recently adopted FY 2024-2028 TIP approved by the YMPO Executive Board on June 29, 2023. For this reason, YMPO is not allowed to use the FY 2024-2028 TIP until an Air Quality Conformity Analysis is done, and it has been approved by the FHWA. The current federally approved TIP remains to be the FY 2022-26 TIP.

FHWA recommended moving all the projects from the FY 2024-2028 TIP to the previously adopted FY 2022-2026 TIP because an Air Quality Conformity Analysis was done for the previously adopted TIP, and it was approved and found in conformity by the FHWA. Only those new projects that are not in conformance with the LRTP will require an Air Quality Conformity Analysis and are included as part of the FY 2022-45 LRTP amendment #1 currently in progress.

By moving all the projects to the FY2022-2026 TIP YMPO members can continue with their projects if the projects are in conformance with the LRTP. Some of the existing projects are already part of the FY2022-2026 TIP, but they have been moved from a different fiscal year, replaced with another type of funding or local contribution has changed.

In the attached tables below, you will find the proposed changes. The tables only include projects that are being proposed to be removed from the TIP table in red text, modified or new projects are highlighted in colors.

For the Yuma County project, the Air Quality Conformity Analysis has been done from County 23<sup>rd</sup> to County 18<sup>th</sup>. However, the LRTP identifies the construction in FY2027. On November 9, 2023, YMPO advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the LRTP that was electronically sent to over 30 different engineering consulting companies, mainly in Arizona, with some in the Yuma region. The deadline for submitting questions about the RFP was November 20, 2023. All the questions were answered by the Executive Director as mentioned on the RFP on November 21, 2023, by posting the questions and answers on the YMPO website.

The RFP proposals were due by 3:00 PM local time on December 7, 2023, and TAC members were asked to evaluate and rank the proposal by December 12, 2023. One proposal was received, members will have the opportunity to discuss if the proposal met the project requirements outlined in the scope of work and provide a possible recommendation to the Executive Board.

#### SUMMARY:

On August 31, 2023, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) formally established Safety Projections for the state of Arizona for 2024. These Safety Projections (SP) are based on the Safety Performance Measures established by the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Safety Performance Management (Safety PM) final ruling and are based on five year rolling averages.

The 2024 Arizona Safety Performance Projections established by ADOT are as follows and increase or decrease compared to the 2023 Arizona SP:

- 1. Number of Fatalities: 1286.1, 86.1 increase
- 2. Rate of Fatalities per 100 million VMT: 1.745, .09 increase
- 3. Number of Serious Injuries: 3636.0, -23.4 decrease
- 4. Rate of Serious Injuries per 100 million VMT: 5.001, -0.038 decrease
- 5. Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities & Serious Injuries: 883.5, -89.9 decrease

The SP Projections (Targets) set by ADOT are data-driven and realistic; and are intended to keep the state focused on improving safety while still striving for the goal of the Strategic Regional Transportation Safety Plan (SRTSP) and the State Strategic Highway Safety Plan (AZ-SHSP) of reducing the number of fatalities and serious injury crashes on Arizona's roadways.

ADOT requests a letter from your MPO within 180 days of the effective date, August 31, 2023, indicating whether your MPO supports ADOT's SP Projections or identifying your MPO's SP Projections.

A draft letter is attached that agrees that YMPO intends to adopt the 2024 Arizona Safety Performance Projections established by ADOT for possible recommendation for approval by the Board.

Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) has the option of supporting the ADOT Safety Performance (SP) Projections or of establishing their own SP projections within 180 days of state projections establishment. ADOT recommends adopting state SP projections. MPOs that choose to set separate projections must report VMT estimates used and the methodology to develop estimates and should maximize use of HPMS data when preparing estimates.

- Safety Projections are reported to ADOT, and made available to FHWA, upon request.
- MPO Safety Projections are not included in the assessment of whether a State met or made significant progress toward meeting its projections.
- Safety Projections are reported annually in the Arizona Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Report.
- 23 CFR 490.213(b) says: "The MPOs shall annually report their established safety targets to their respective State DOT, in a manner that is documented and mutually agreed upon by both parties."
- 23 CFR 490.209(c) (1) states: "The MPOs shall establish targets not later than 180 days after the respective State DOT establishes and reports projections in the state HSIP annual report."

# YMPO INFORMATION SUMMARY for Agenda Item 11 Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot (DCIP) Program Grant

DATE: December 14, 2023

**SUBJECT:** Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot (DCIP) Program Grant Opportunity.

#### SUMMARY:

The DCIP Program is a Department of Defense effort administered by the Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (OLDCC). The program is a competitive grant program to enable State and Local projects to address deficiencies in community infrastructure in support of Local military installations. YMPO was alerted to this program in late May 2022, through the Greater Yuma Economic Development Corporation (GYEDC). YMPO's first participation in the DCIP grant program was in FY22 and YMPO working together with YPG and ADOT, submitted a successful grant application and the grant agreement was executed for ~\$13M by ADOT at the end of September 2022 for US-95.

During the FY23 grant cycle 17 DCIP grants were awarded for a total of \$100M. For FY24 the grant program will again be available. OLDCC has communicated that the appropriations and authorizations have not yet been finalized, but they are encouraging perspective recipients to begin drafting proposals for this competitive grant program. This possible grant application would be targeted to partial funding for the construction of US-95 from Imperial Dam Rd to Aberdeen Rd.

More information on appropriations should become available in January 2024 and this will be followed by a notice of funding opportunity in March 2024.

On May 2023, the Board approved the FY 24-25 Unified Planning Work Program which outlines local funds to carry out discretionary grant opportunities.
