**5. Roads of Regional Significance Study Proposals**

On January 21, 2025, YMPO released the request for proposal (RFP) to develop a Roads of Regional Significance Study (RORS) in the YMPO region. The deadline for consultants to submit proposals was Monday, February 24, 2025. Three proposals from Wilson & Company, Kimley-Horn, and CivTech were submitted to YMPO.

TAC members have received all the proposals for review and were asked to evaluate and rank them by March 5, 2025. TAC members will review the scoring summary and recommend the preferred consultant team to the Executive Board.

**6. FY 2022-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Administrative Amendment #2**

The FY 2022-26 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 29, 2021, and has since been amended eighteen times, most recently on February 27, 2025, through the Executive Board.

Administrative amendment #2 will include corrections to the project name and description of a Yuma County project. ADOT has requested that the name and description be changed to match the HSIP application and the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA). This administrative amendment involves four projects. YC 23-04D, YC 23-04R, YC 23-04 C1 and C2. All the projects must have the same project name and project description.

**7. FY 2022-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #20**

The FY 2022-26 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 29, 2021, and has since been amended eighteen times, most recently on February 27, 2024, through the Executive Board.

Amendment #20 involves three City of Yuma projects. The first project request is to increase the local funds from \$28,788 to \$2,447,961 for 40th Street: 6-3/4 E to 7-1/2 E HURF exchange project this fiscal year. The City of Yuma also requests to move two Carbon Reduction Projects (CRP) from FY 2025 to FY 2026.

**8. Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Update**

The latest update from the developing program consultant indicates a call for projects will likely occur on March 24, 2025.

### **1. Call to Order and Declaration of Votes**

Acting Chairman Frank Sanchez called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. The City of Yuma declared votes: Steve Wilson (4), Erika Peterson (1).

### **2. Title VI of the Civil Rights ACT of 1964**

YMPO Title VI Coordinator/Mobility Manager JR Aguilar read the YMPO Title VI Nondiscrimination Notice to the Public. YMPO has survey cards on the TAC website, for the public to complete. Please send these to JR Aguilar, YMPO Mobility Manager, at [jraguilar@ympo.org](mailto:jraguilar@ympo.org).

### **3. Call to the Public**

There were no announcements from the public or TAC members.

### **4. Approval of Minutes**

Approval of the January 9, 2025, TAC minutes. Kelly Fricke, Public Works Director, Yuma County, moved to approve the January 9, 2025, minutes. Steve Wilson, Assistant City Engineer, City of Yuma, seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried.

### **5. ADOT Functional Classification and Ownership Change Presentation**

Lucas Murray, from ADOT, provided information on tools that allow member agencies to submit functional classification change requests and ownership change notifications to ADOT.

Frank Sanchez, County Engineer, asked about the approval timeframe. Mr. Murray explained that it can vary sometimes from two weeks to a month.

Fernando Villegas, YMPO Senior Transportation Planner, asked about the type of MPO approval. Mr. Murray explained that the more official the information, the better. ADOT has seen just a simple email from the MPO for some requests stating that the MPO is in agreement with the request. ADOT needs a document to pass on to FHWA to prove that the MPO has seen it, but ADOT prefers a more official document, like an adopted resolution.

Steve Wilson, City of Yuma, asked how often the functional classification is updated for YMPO. Mr. Murray explained that he didn't know since this was his first year working on functional classifications. Mr. Murray will try to get that information.

Mr. Wilson also stated that after the adoption of the City of Yuma Transportation Master Plan and the YMPO Long-Range Transportation Plan update, probably will be a good time to update the functional classifications.

This item was on the agenda for information and comments only.

**6. Complete Streets Concept Study (CSCS)**

Consultant Kimley-Horn provided a progress update on the complete streets planning process and the inventory of road types in the region.

Ryan McKell provided Information on the top 20 locations for bus pullouts and prioritization in the YMPO region.

Chris Joannes provided information on performance measures and prioritization elements. Performance measures were divided into safety, connectivity, mobility, equity, and public support. Christ asked the TAC members for feedback regarding whether to weigh each performance measure equally or give one more weight.

Mr. Sanchez commented that safety should be given more priority and that we should give safety more weight.

Mr. Sanchez also asked about the bus pullout locations on Highway 95, along County 15<sup>th</sup> and Avenue C. He explained that he didn't see a need for a bus pullout on Avenue C. Mr. Joannes stated that they would do more research to get more information about ridership at that location.

Mr. Wilson commented on the bus pullout location at 32<sup>nd</sup> Street and Pacific Avenue, which is listed as number 3. Mr. Wilson stated that this location is a high crash area in the City of Yuma, and it is possible that this intersection will become wider in the future.

**7. FY 2026-2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Update**

Vamshi Yellisetty, Senior Planner with Kittelson & Associates, provided an update on the overall project progress, phase 2 public outreach, a preliminary list of key projects being evaluated, and a timeline for near-term key milestones.

Mr. Yellisetty informed the TAC members that a map would be provided regarding unpaved roads in their jurisdictions.

Mr. Wilson asked a question regarding the Performance-Based Alternative Analysis. Mr. Wilson would like to include a model scenario for the City of Yuma

Transportation Master Plan that includes the changes to the MCAS main entrance. Mr. Wilson stated this would impact vehicles using 40<sup>th</sup> Street, Avenue 3E, and 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Avenue A.

Antonio Martinez, MCAS, stated that the relocation of the main entrance has been a plan. However, due to security, MCAS has not settled on the location of the main entrance on County 14<sup>th</sup> Street. He informed YMPO that they are working on providing the information soon.

Mr. Sanchez stated that the timeline is critical to incorporate the relocation of the LRTP.

This item was on the agenda for information and comments only.

**8. Arizona Sun Cloud Data Portal Statewide Implementation**

Brian Rubin, MAG Transportation Planner, provided information on the additional federal AID Grant awarded to MAG and ADOT to support the expansion of the Arizona Sun Cloud Data Portal statewide. YMPO will receive access to all the data collected, and YMPO can become a contributor or technical partner.

Jeff Heinrichs, IT Manager/Associate Planner, explained that YMPO will be involved in the decision-making process by becoming a contributor, while a technical partner is just a portal user.

Mr. Wilson asked about the timeline for including the rest of the state in the portal. Mr. Rubin informed the TAC members that we are in the project's early stages, but he thinks it could be finalized within the next three years.

Mr. Sanchez asked how the data is obtained from the local jurisdictions. Mr. Rubin recognized that not all jurisdictions have the data; some data is purchased, and ADOT state-wide data is used.

Mr. Sanchez asked staff if the member agencies would need to contribute to becoming a contributor. Mr. Heinrichs stated that YMPO will contribute with YMPO funds or in kind.

**Mr. Sanchez made a motion to recommend to the Executive Board to become a contributor partner. Mr. Wilson seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried.**

**9. Roads of Regional Significance Study RFP Update**

Ms. Villegas informed the TAC members that YMPO released the RFP on January 21, 2025. Monday was the last day for consultants to submit any questions regarding the RFP. YMPO posted the answers to all the questions on our YMPO website.

The Consultants have until February 24 to submit their proposals. YMPO staff will deliver all the proposals to the TAC members on the same day, and TAC members will evaluate and rank the proposals.

The TAC members will recommend the most qualified Consultant to the Executive Board during the March TAC meeting. The Executive Board will review and approve the recommended firm selected for the RORS during the Executive Board Meeting on March 27, 2025.

The notice to proceed to the consultant will be issued in early April, and a draft of the Roads of Regional Significance Study is expected early next year in January. The final document should be ready by February 2026.

Mr. Sanchez asked how much time TAC members will have to review the proposals. Mr. Villegas explained that the TAC members will have a week to complete the evaluation and ranking.

This item was on the agenda for information and discussion only.

**10. AZ SMART Program Overview**

Mr. Villegas provided an overview of the AZ SMART program and some of the recent changes. Before the changes, only cities, towns, counties, and ADOT could apply for these funds. Today, with the recent changes, MPOs, tribes, and non-profit and for-profit organizations can apply for funding if the entity/agency competes for a federal discretionary surface transportation grant.

Member agencies have received almost \$11 million in AZ SMART funds and \$44.5 million in federal grants in the last two years. The AZ SMART program has 18.7 million available funding, and now, with the changes, the State Transportation Board can move funds from one category to another. Right now, they have \$3.7 million in each category.

Mr. Villegas informed TAC members that YMPO intends to apply for the AZ SMART funds this year to reimburse the non-federal match awarded for the Safe Streets and Roads for ALL (SS4A) grant program. YMPO was awarded \$400,000 in federal funds to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, and the local match is \$100,000.

Mr. Sanchez asked about the funding categories and whether YMPO would be included in the same category as Yuma County. Mr. Villegas stated that YMPO will be in the same category as Yuma County.

The YMPO Executive Board approved a resolution supporting the AZ SMART application during its meeting on December 12, 2024.

Mr. Villegas also informed TAC members about the YMPO letter of approval. If any member agency is applying for the AZ SMART program, a letter of approval from YMPO is required as part of the application process. Please request a letter of approval as soon as possible to avoid delays in your application.

Mr. Sanchez stated that Yuma County would like a letter supporting their application for the Railroad Crossing Elimination study from YMPO.

Mr. Wilson also stated that they would like to get a letter of support for their projects.

This item is on the agenda for information and discussion only at this stage.

**11. Proposal for Gary Knight Memorial Highway**

Mr. Heinrichs presented this item, informing TAC members that on December 30, 2024, a proposal was submitted to the Arizona State Board on Geographic and Historic Names (ASBGHN) to name U.S. 95 from milepost 31 to 48 the Gary Knight Memorial Highway, including Resolution 156 by the Executive Board supporting the effort.

The proposal was submitted as part of the collaborative, multi-stage process. Every proposal receives thorough research and opportunities for community stakeholders to provide feedback to the ASBGHN Board in its consideration.

Mr. Heinrichs encouraged TAC members to provide support using the Proposed Name Response Form for the late YMPO Executive Board Chairman and City of Yuma Councilmember Gary Knight. The approval process takes at least two months, and the naming of the Gary Knight Memorial Highway will be eligible for a vote at the April 22, 2025, ASBGHN regular Board meeting.

Ms. Peterson asked about the link provided on the agenda packet. Mr. Heinrichs informed TAC members that a new link was uploaded with the agenda packet.

**12. FY 2022-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #19**

Mr. Villegas presented TIP Amendment #19, which includes the YMPO Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, which has been awarded \$400,000 in federal funding as part of the TIP. YMPO is applying for the inclusion of the planning document since YMPO is responsible for \$100,000 in a local match.

Approval of this amendment will include this project as part of the TIP in FY 2026.

Mr. Sanchez asked if the Railroad Crossing Elimination study could be included in the amendment. Mr. Villegas agreed to include it for Executive Board approval.

**Motion by Frank Sanchez to recommend the FY 2022-2026 YMPO TIP Amendment #19 for approval to the Executive Board, including the Yuma County Railroad Crossing Elimination study. Mr. Wilson seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried.**

**13. YMPO and ADOT**

YMPO and ADOT staff presented updates on any other business not fully covered in previous agenda items.

- a. Mr. Villegas stated that YMPO had no additional business to discuss.
- b. ADOT MPD Update – Jennifer Hobert, Regional Planner, ADOT, updated on the HSIP projects information. This is the first time local agencies do not have to initiate the HSIP projects.

**14. In-Kind Match Forms**

Under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)'s Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program, the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) set-aside provides funding to build a variety of alternative transportation projects that achieve safer, connected, and equitable on and off-road networks for all users. The TAP encompasses a variety of smaller-scale alternative-mode transportation and related projects. These projects may include pedestrian and bicycle facilities, recreational trails, Safe Routes To School projects (SRTS), historic preservation, vegetation management and environmental mitigation projects related to stormwater and habitat connectivity.

The call for projects for this next round of TA applications is scheduled for March 24. ADOT expects to maintain a budget of approximately \$17 million annually for the TA program.
