YMPO received a regional letter of support request from the City of Yuma for the U.S. Department of Transportation Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) grant program. The proposed Automated Traffic Signal Performance Measure (ATSPM) project would synchronize traffic signals in the City of Yuma to promote better traffic flow and improved safety.

The Smart grant program funding would improve traffic signal synchronization on the 4th Avenue and 16th Street Corridors, resulting in efficient signal timing and corridor travel progression.

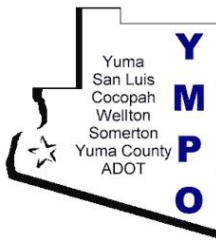

1. **Call to Order and Declaration of Votes**

Chairman, Frank Sanchez called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

He also informed the committee that Member Erika Peterson, Associate Planner, City of Yuma, had been promoted to Senior Planner and that change would be updated for the next meeting's agenda.

Chairman Sanchez also informed the committee of its new Member, Arturo Durazo, Tribal Planner, Cocopah Indian Tribe.

The City of Yuma declared votes. City of Yuma, Dave Wostenberg (3) Erika Peterson (2),

2. **Title VI of the Civil Rights ACT of 1964**

The YMPO Title VI Nondiscrimination Notice to the Public was read by YMPO Mobility Manager, JR Aguilar.

3. **Call to the Public**

There were no announcements from the public or TAC members.

4. **Approval of Minutes**

June 13, 2024, TAC meeting minutes were included with the agenda.

Greg Ellingson, Public Works Director, Town of Wellton, moved to approve the June 13, 2024, minutes. Charles Gutierrez, Public Works Director, City of Somerton, seconded the motion. Motion carried.

5. **FY 2026-2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Update**

Vamshi Yellisetty, Kittleson & Associates Consultant, presented this item.

Mr. Yellisetty gave an update on the status of the LRTP topics below:

Task 4 update: Currently working on this task to draft existing conditions report by the end of this month.

Task 5 update: Phase 1 of the public involvement ends on July 31st, 2024. Phase 2 starts on September 2024.

Task 6 update: The consultant is compiling a list of potential solutions for improving each mode based on their observations of existing conditions. The Consultant will coordinate small group meetings with each member agency.

Mr. Yellisetty added that population projections for the Yuma Region are expected to grow by over 33% over the next 25 years. Mr. Yellisetty also added

that the Safety Analysis they performed was completed, and the number of crashes has fallen over the past year. However, the number of fatal and serious injury crashes has increased during that same period. Mr. Yellisetty also stated they completed their Multimodal Connectivity Review of all regional bike and pedestrian facilities. He concluded that there are high vehicle volumes and speeds on key routes, which make it uncomfortable for bike and pedestrian users, and because of this, they need alternative routes. Mr. Yellisetty added that the top two complaints they've received from public outreach are the region's road congestion and traffic safety.

Chairman Sanchez asked Mr. Yellisetty if the area map and the public comments are available to view/read in Spanish.

Mr. Yellisetty answered that he would double-check and get back to him on that, but he thinks the option is there.

6. Complete Streets Concept Study Proposals

Fernando Villegas, YMPO Senior Transportation Planner, presented this item. Mr. Villegas informed the committee that two proposals were submitted to YMPO for the Complete Street Concept Study—one from Wilson & Company and the second from Kimley-Horn. TAC members were asked to review the proposals, and scoring sheets were submitted to YMPO on or before July 15.

YMPO staff received seven scoring sheets from the TAC members and the scores show that Kimley-Horn got the highest score, with an average final score of 88.6 points; five TAC members were in favor of selecting Kimley-Horn, and two TAC members selected Wilson & Company.

Dave Wostenberg, City of Yuma Engineer, motioned to recommend Kimley-Horn to the Executive Board. Charles Gutierrez, City of Somerton Public Works Director, seconded the motion. Motion carried.

7. FY 2022-26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #16

Mr. Villegas presented this item. Mr. Villegas informed the committee that with this amendment came the following two changes:

City of Yuma Project Name Change:

- From B Canal Bridge on Avenue 4E to B Canal Bridge Structure No. 08517

5310 Programs Added that were funded as part of the appeal process:

- Yuma and Foothills Fleet Preventative Maintenance
- Cutaway With lift-14 Passenger Replacement 3673

Dave Wostenberg, City Engineer, City of Yuma motioned to recommend the FY2022-26 YMPO TIP Amendment #16 for approval by the Executive Board. Kelly Fricke, Public Works Director, Yuma County, seconded the motion. Motion carried.

8. Possible Regional Project Priority List for 2025

Mr. Villegas informed the TAC members that funds for the Regional Priority Projects will not be available during this fiscal year due to the State deficit. Mr. Villegas also added that the RTAC Board recommended using the same Regional Priority Project list with a 20% inflation adjustment. Mr. Villegas continued by stating that all the existing projects and their funding levels would remain the same. Each region would have the opportunity to adjust within their overall total allocation. Any such adjustments would need to be provided to RTAC by September 16th to be included in the materials and presentations at the Rural Transportation Summit this year in October.

Mr. Villegas presented a table showing YMPO allocations in FY 2024 and the allocations with the 20 % increase. Mr. Villegas also reminded the TAC members that three projects were selected: US-95 Wellton-Mohawk to Aberdeen Road, US-95 Pavement Rehabilitation (phase 2) between County 17th St and Avenue D, and Somerton Main Street Improvements. If the same projects are recommended to the Executive Board, the jurisdictions need to update the project fact sheets.

Chairman Sanchez addressed the TAC members, commenting that a Yuma County project, US 95 Co. 22nd Street to County 17th Street Mill and Fill, is going out for bid on 07/29. Mr. Sanchez asked Mr. Villegas when the project sheets needed to be sent to him.

Mr. Villegas answered that by September 16th, 2024.

Crystal Figueroa, YMPO Executive Director, addressed the committee, commenting that her deadline recommendation for the adjusted project sheets should be prior to the August 8th TAC Meeting to have time to present for approval to the Executive Board Meeting that same month.

Chairman Sanchez stated that he was okay with resubmitting the same projects, but if TAC members had another project to add or edit, to let it be known.

9. YMPO FY 2025 Title VI Non-Discrimination in Federal Assisted Programs, Accomplishments & Goals Report

JR Aguilar, Mobility Manager, YMPO presented this item to the committee with a copy of both reports and added that ADOT had done a preliminary check on them, and small changes were recommended by them. He also stated that the changes were completed, and the reports were going to be sent to ADOT on the August 1st, 2024, deadline.

Mr. Gutierrez suggested that the report be left justified and that the “Madam Chair” verbiage be changed because it wasn’t being used anymore.

No suggestions on verbiage replacement were given.

Mr. Gutierrez commented that the tables and analysis that were provided in both reports needed to have citations.

Mr. Aguilar stated he would add those changes.

Dave Wostenberg motioned to recommend for approval by the Executive Board with the changes mentioned. Charles Gutierrez seconded the motion.

10. 25th Annual Arizona Rural Transportation Summit (RTS)

Ms. Figueroa presented this item. Ms. Figueroa informed the committee of the conference dates, 10/16-10/18, 2024, and informed members that Executive Board members attend this conference regularly. Ms. Figueroa informed the committee that this conference will present an award during the ceremony and provided the committee with a copy of the Awards Nomination Form.

Will Randolph, ADOT Regional Planner, informed the TAC members that the 2025-2029 construction program was just approved by the State Transportation Board last month, so they are moving forward now with the 2026-2029 construction program.

Mr. Randolph also added that project initiation on the TA (Transportation Alternative) Program is mostly done, and if any of the agencies present have projects in that program, to coordinate with ADOT.

Mr. Randolph then stated that applications for the HSIP projects were due last May 3rd, 2024, and they are done reviewing those as preliminary and should be no asking agencies for paperwork. If any agency has any questions, to reach out to ADOT. Mr. Randolph informed the TAC members that ADOT’s Statewide Safety Plan and Active Transportation Safety Action Plan have public participation results

on their website.

Mr. Randolph informed TAC members that agencies should continue to work with ADOT LPA for the Off System Bridge project applications because ADOT has already sent out eligibility letters and project initiation requirements.

Mr. Randolph stated that ADOT's studies are still in motion, and he has been working on a couple. If agency members have any questions regarding these plans and studies, they should contact him directly.

Mr. Randolph informed the TAC members that ADOT had concluded their interview process for the new Regional Planner, and Jennifer Hobert was selected for the job.

Ms. Figueroa asked Mr. Randolph if he knew the date the award would be announced for the HSIP applications submitted on May 3rd, 2024.

Mr. Randolph said it would be this month anytime soon, but he would follow up about the specific date.

SUMMARY:

During the July 18, 2024, TAC meeting, the TAC members agreed to review and update the fact sheets for the Regional Priority Projects. After reviewing the fact sheets, the TAC members must recommend the 2025 Regional Priority Projects to the Executive Board for approval.

RTAC Board has recommended using the same Regional Priority Project list with a 20% inflation adjustment for the next fiscal year and introducing the bill again next year. Fact sheets must be submitted to RTAC on September 16, 2024, to be included in the materials and presentations at the Rural Transportation Summit this year in October.

The population-based division of that amount estimated the possible allocation of funds to the YMPO region at about \$48 million.

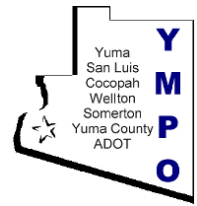

On behalf of the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization (YMPO), we are pleased to express our enthusiastic support for the City of Yuma's application to the U.S. Department of Transportation Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) program. The proposed Automated Traffic Signal Performance Measure (ATSPM) project would synchronize traffic signals in the City of Yuma to promote better traffic flow and improved safety. ATSPM would be an enabling technology that leverages data collection and analysis for proactive traffic signal system management using performance measures.

The Stage 1 activities would improve traffic signal synchronization on the 4th Avenue and 16th Street Corridors resulting in efficient signal timings and corridor travel progression. The traffic signals would be connected to a Transportation Management Center (TMC) that the City of Yuma is currently designing. Over a 10-year period, the project would reduce crashes by 25% (1231 crashes), reduce travel time significantly (over 25 years total), and save an estimated 109,000 gallons of fuel.

Enhanced traffic flow would attract businesses and investment, leading to increased job opportunities and stimulate the local economy, which would greatly benefit the disadvantaged communities in the area. This initiative enhances urban resilience through improved transportation coordination and responsiveness. Approximately 46% of the total population along the project live in disadvantaged communities based on the USDOT Equitable Transportation Community (ETC) Explorer tool. Optimized traffic signal timing will provide smoother traffic flow and reduced congestion, thus making it easier for public transit vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians to navigate through corridors of the 4th Avenue and 16th Street Corridors.

YMPO recognizes the importance of this project in facilitating safer, more efficient mobility options for residents and visitors and supports the ATSPM project. As we work to advance and improve the quality of life within the Yuma region, these efforts will support a more livable and sustainable community and improve the quality of life for the citizens of Yuma.

Please consider this letter of formal endorsement of the City of Yuma Automated Traffic Signal Performance Measure (ATSPM) project. We look forward to seeing the positive changes this project will bring to our region and are proud to support its implementation.

At their meeting on August 22, 2024, the YMPO Executive Board, the YMPO policy-making body, unanimously approved this letter of support for the City of Yuma's application for SMART Program funding.

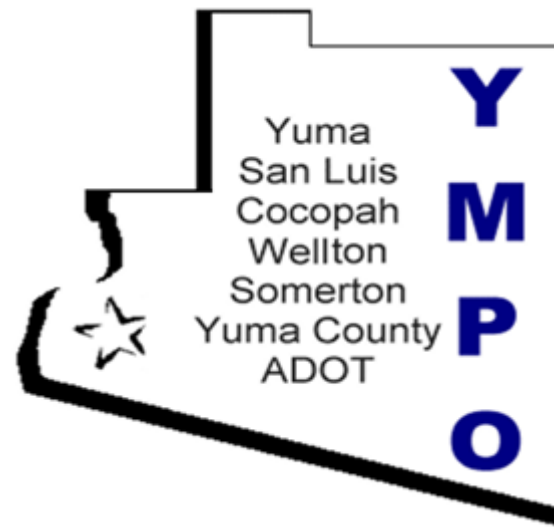
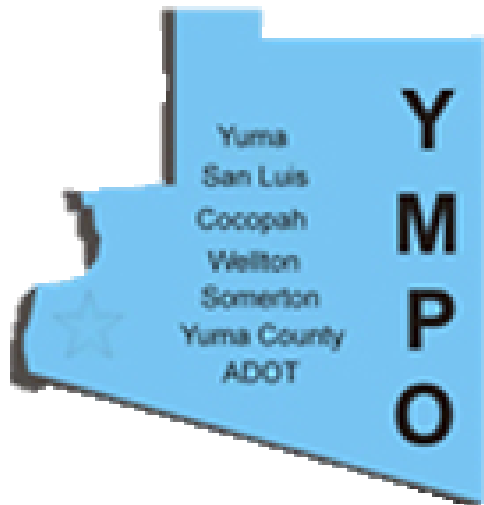
