6. **Comprehensive Safety Action Plan Proposals**

On March 26, 2026. YMPO released the request for proposal (RFP) to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP) in the YMPO region, excluding the City of Yuma, since the City of Yuma is currently developing the Road Safety Action Plan.

The deadline for consultants to submit proposals was Thursday, April 23, 2026. Two proposals from High Street Consulting Group and Greenlight were submitted to YMPO.

TAC members have received all the proposals for review and were asked to evaluate and rank them by April 30, 2026. TAC members will review the scoring summary and recommend the proposal to the Executive Board.

**7. FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP Amendment #6**

The FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 31, 2025, and has since been amended five times, most recently on April 30, 2026, by the Executive Board.

This amendment will move the construction of the Shared Use Pathway, East Wetland Park to Pacific Avenue in the City of Yuma from FY 2026 to FY 2027.

**8. RTAC Regional Transportation Priority Projects for 2026 - Update**

During the ongoing 2026 legislative session, RTAC supported Transportation Priority Projects associated with House Bill (HB) 2304 and the Arizona SMART Fund (HB 2760). While both measures received hearings before the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee on February 18, 2026, and passed, they did not move forward in the legislative process.

**2. Declaration of Votes.**

The City of Yuma declared votes: Dave Wostenberg (2), Erika Peterson (2), and Alex Tipton (1). Yuma County declared votes: Kelly Fricke (1), Frank Sanchez (1).

**3. Title VI of the Civil Rights ACT of 1964**

JR Aguilar, YMPO Title VI Coordinator/Mobility Manager, read the YMPO Title VI Nondiscrimination Notice to the Public.

Mr. Aguilar presented the Title VI self-identification survey cards to the TAC Committee members, explaining that participation was voluntary and based on self-identification. He also stated that the survey cards are located at the front office and on the YMPO website. He mentioned that completed paper survey cards can be given to him directly or via email at [jraguilar@ympo.org](mailto:jraguilar@ympo.org).

**4. Call to the Public**

Two members of the public were present and were provided with an opportunity to introduce themselves and share information with the Committee.

Gene Dalbey, YRBC, who identified himself as an advocate for bicycling, shared that he had been actively collecting and repairing bicycles, receiving approximately 18 - 25 bicycles every two weeks from Yuma County, in an effort to provide people with an alternative means of transportation. Mr. Dalbey further discussed the importance of bike safety being included in the City of Yuma and Yuma County's Roadway Safety Action Plan (RSAP) to ensure bicycle considerations remained a priority. He noted a shift in planning efforts where bicycles were increasingly being considered early in the planning process and expressed hope that this approach would continue.

Raul Castillo, introduced himself as a representative of S.M.I.L.E, an organization which specializes in services for youth and adults with disabilities and thanked the Committee for the opportunity to be present.

**5. Approval of Minutes**

Approval of the March 12, 2026, TAC Meeting minutes.

**MOTION:** Erika Peterson, Senior Planner, City of Yuma, motioned to approve the February 12, 2026, Meeting Minutes. Kelly Fricke, Public Works Director, Yuma County, seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

**6. FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP Amendment #5**

Crystal Figueroa, Executive Director, YMPO, presented this item to the Committee informing them that the FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 31, 2025, and had since been amended four times, most recently on March 26, 2026, by the Executive Board.

Executive Director Figueroa presented the first change that pertained to the City of Somerton's County 15<sup>th</sup> Street and Avenue D Crest-Curve project funding. She stated there was an increase in HSIP funding of \$223,830 with the final estimated construction set to \$710,000 that of which \$669,530 was HSIP funds and the local match of \$40,470. She then stated that the City of Somerton had received an eligibility letter detailing the increase in cost.

Ms. Figueroa also reported a funding reduction for the Yuma County Area Transit (YCIPTA) Rural Operations project funding from \$646,242 to \$125,679.

Eulogio Vera, Public Works Director, City of San Luis, notified TAC members that the City of San Luis received notice from ADOT that the Los Alamos Curve Realignment HSIP project required additional local funding of \$40,000 due to increased costs associated with the environmental monitoring of the Flat-Tailed Horned Lizard and project management costs.

Chairman Dave Wostenberg, City Engineer, City of Yuma, asked Mr. Vera if these funds were required for ADOT to advertise the project and added that the City of Yuma was experiencing similar increases and would be pursuing a TIP amendment to address additional local funding for those projects. Mr. Vera confirmed that the funds were needed for ADOT to advertise the project.

Frank Sanchez, County Engineer, Yuma County, asked for clarity on whether the City of San Luis was asking the Committee for additional HSIP funds to cover the required local match.

Chairman Wostenberg responded that the additional funds being requested by the City of San Luis were for the City's local match and not additional HSIP funding.

Executive Director Figueroa clarified that any additional funding needed for local match would have to be covered by the City of San Luis and cannot be aided by any HSIP funding.

Chairman Wostenberg mentioned the City of Yuma would be working with Fernando Villegas, Senior Transportation Planner, YMPO, regarding their project funding revisions.

Mr. Sanchez asked that the City of Somerton project be shown on the screen to review funding changes. Executive Director Figueroa noted the City of Somerton's project costs had previously decreased significantly, but had now increased due to updated construction estimates.

**MOTION:** RoseAna Douglas, Public Works Director, City of Somerton, motioned to recommend approval of the FY 2026-30 YMPO TIP Amendment #5 to the Executive Board. Mr. Sanchez seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

**7. Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program**

Jeff Heinrichs, IT Manager/Associate Planner, YMPO, provided an overview of the TA Program, explaining that it is a federally supported competitive grant program funded through a set-aside of the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL). He noted that the program improves safety, connectivity, and quality of life while reducing reliance on motor vehicles.

Mr. Heinrichs then reported that the FY2027 TA Call for Projects opened from February 27 to April 3, 2026, with approximately \$16.98 million available statewide, including \$11.1 million for new projects and \$5.85 awarded to projects from previous funding cycles. He noted that the previously awarded City of Yuma shared-use pathway from 6E to 36th Street along 32nd towards the East Mesa Community Park received \$424,350 in design funds in FY27 and \$1.2 million in construction funds in FY29.

Mr. Heinrichs also stated that during the most recent call for projects, YMPO received eight formal requests for Letters of Support across Yuma County, the City of San Luis, the City of Yuma, and Crane Schools. He explained that ADOT is currently reviewing and screening applications and will evaluate projects based on technical quality and readiness, plan alignment, and regional/community impact. Final rankings will be forwarded to the State Transportation Board, with selected projects programmed across FY27–FY29.

**8. Comprehensive Safety Action Plan RFP Update**

Executive Director Figueroa presented this item, stating that in FY24, YMPO was awarded a \$400,000 SS4A grant. She informed the Committee that YMPO, had also applied for \$100,000 in AZ SMART funds to help cover the local match required for that grant.

She continued by informing the Committee that the SS4A grant agreement was signed on March 10, 2026. She also stated that on March 26, 2026, YMPO released a request for proposal (RFP) to develop the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP) with an expected due date of April 23, 2026. She mentioned

that on May 14, 2026, TAC members would receive all proposals and have a 2-week evaluation period to recommend a Consultant to the Executive Board. She added that a special TAC meeting may be scheduled for May 28, 2026, if interviews are necessary.

**9. YMPO FY 2026 Title VI Update, Training and Guidance**

Mr. Aguilar presented the Title VI Program and the upcoming plan update.

The presentation outlined recent regulatory changes, including updates from ADOT training and revised FHWA/FTA guidance. Mr. Aguilar emphasized that Title VI serves as the foundation for all YMPO activities, ensuring non-discrimination and equal access across planning, public involvement, transit, and transportation programs. The updated Title VI Plan incorporates a 16-element compliance checklist and reflects key changes such as revised terminology, removal of certain environmental justice references, updated submission timelines, and expanded language access requirements, including availability of materials in Spanish and on-demand translation services. This plan will be submitted to ADOT's Civil Rights Office in mid-April.

Mr. Aguilar detailed YMPO's organizational roles and responsibilities, demographic data integration, and public participation requirements, including the use of mapping and census data to ensure equitable project planning. He noted that YMPO has received no Title VI complaints in recent years and maintains procedures for complaint tracking and reporting and informed the committee that the ADOT compliance review is scheduled for April 28, 2026.

**10. YMPO and ADOT**

**YMPO ADOT MPD** (Updates provided by Executive Director Figueroa and Ms. Hobert)

Executive Director Figueroa presented the YMPO March 2026 Newsletter and informed the committee that it focused on discretionary funding and how it's beneficial to the rural areas of our region. She pointed out that the newsletter mentions HSIP, TA Program, and 5305(e) funding updates and details.

Jennifer Hobert, Senior Planner, ADOT updated the committee about the TA Program Call for Projects end date of April 3, 2026. She also mentioned that ADOT

updated their timeline to May 2, 2026, to have all the application reviews completed.

Chairman Wostenberg inquired whether the City of Yuma would be penalized for submitting Stage 3 plans to ADOT for the city's TA projects. He noted it was previously anticipated that they would submit 95% plans but were unable to because of delays with ADOT PMs. Ms. Hobert responded that while applications would not necessarily be penalized, additional questions or clarification may arise during the review process.

Chairman Wostenberg asked Ms. Hobert for an update on Off-System Bridge (OSB) grant funding, to which Ms. Hobert responded that there was no update at this time and that applications remained under review by the Bridge Selection Committee.

Ms. Hobert further provided updates on the NextMove Arizona initiative, noting that the project website, [www.nextmoveaz.com](http://www.nextmoveaz.com), was live and included information on stakeholder engagement, upcoming events, and a public survey. She also mentioned that the LAT Transfer Study was underway and that a project meeting was scheduled for April 16 from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. with invitations distributed to the project team.

## RTAC Regional Transportation Priority Projects

**DATE:** May 14, 2026

**SUBJECT:** RTAC Regional Transportation Priority Projects

### **SUMMARY:**

In 2025, the Rural Transportation Advisory Council (RTAC) coordinated transportation funding requests from rural areas across the State for consideration during the State budget development process, subject to funding availability. The RTAC-backed legislation, HB2034, for possible appropriations for Greater Arizona transportation projects, included 70 projects across Greater Arizona totaling over \$480 million, with approximately \$57M identified for the YMPO region. As part of this effort, HB2760 proposed a \$15M appropriation to the Arizona SMART fund for FY 2026-27. This funding is intended to assist rural communities in securing federal transportation dollars by providing required match funding and supporting project development activities.

The Greater Arizona request focused on pursuing one-time funding to address long-standing transportation infrastructure needs and decades of underinvestment in rural regions.

Currently, the 2026 Legislative process is in its late stage, with most bills having either advanced through committees or no longer moving forward. While HB 2304 and HB 2760 were heard and passed in the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee on February 18, neither bill advanced to the House Appropriations Committee. Additionally, March State revenue collections came in approximately \$19 million below projections, further limiting the availability of funding for new transportation investments.

Looking ahead, the RTAC Board has indicated its intent to pursue another round of one-time transportation funding preparation for the FY 2027-28 State Budget, maintaining a similar request of approximately \$480M statewide, including an estimated \$57M for the YMPO region. Consideration of maintaining or updating the project priority list will be discussed at the TAC and Executive Board levels.
