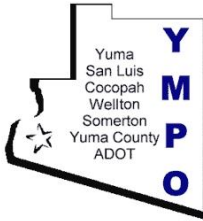

1. **Call to Order and Declaration of Votes**

The YMPO Chair Sam Palacios, called the meeting to order at 9:08am. The City of Yuma declaration of votes: Jennifer Albers 3 votes and Susan Cowy 2 votes.

4. **Approval of Minutes**

The draft minutes of the April 8, 2021, Regular TAC Meeting were presented for discussion and approval.

Jennifer Albers motioned to approve the draft TAC minutes of April 8, 2021, as presented by YMPO staff.

Mark Hoffman seconded.

Motion carried unanimously.

5. **Bureau of Reclamation Project**

Melanie Stepanovic, Civil Engineer with the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) Yuma presented this item. Melanie Stepanovic updated the TAC on the Federal Lands Transportation Program (FLTP) Grant. The Grant is for the Yuma Crossing Bike Path at Levee Road and Pacific Avenue. A member of the Yuma Bicycle Coalition contacted the BOR asking to assess the area, requesting a few improvements to the area. Paul Ward mentioned that YMPO is willing to support the BOR during this process. Jeff Kramer and Jennifer Albers both shared that this bike path is in the City of Yuma's future plan, and both are willing to support the FLTP. Below are images of the location of the proposed Bike Path Crossing.

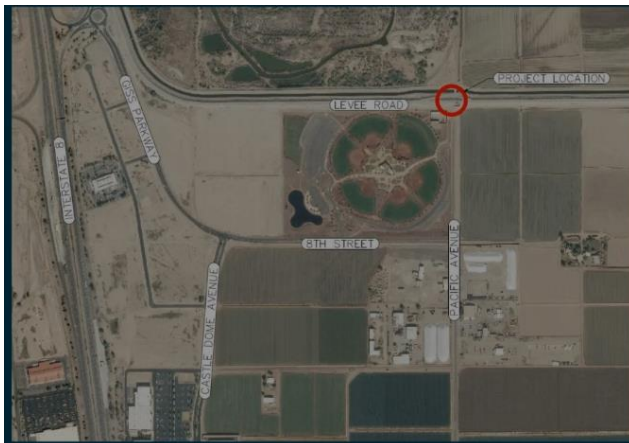


Figure 1. Overview of Proposed Bike Path Crossing Location

6. Long-Range Transportation Plan Update

Vamshi Yellisetty updated the TAC on the progress of the LRTP. The LRTP is in Phase 1 Public Outreach. The comment period for the Public Outreach ends on May 20, 2021. A website was created (GreaterYumaMoves.com) that contains an interactive map, an online survey and has project information. The Outreach Activities include ads in the local newspaper in both English and Spanish, social media outreach, dedicated phone line and email, informational video, email blasts to stakeholders in the region and 2,000 posters and fliers have been distributed. The website has had over 350 visitors and each visitor has spent an average of 4 minutes on the website. Vamshi Yellisetty mentioned he will be sending out a draft goals, objectives, and prioritization list for the TAC to review. Mike Blankenship shared the call for projects for FY 25 & 26 is the first week of July 2021. The final application is due the first week of November. ADOT staff is encouraging all to submit the draft applications early so ADOT staff has time to review the HSIP applications. Mike Blankenship mentioned he has meet with the City of Somerton and ADOT to get their requests in for the HSIP applications. Charles Gutierrez asked if the BC ration was raised, and Mike Blankenship answered that the guidelines have not been updated.

7. Rural Regional Priority Project List

Paul Ward presented on the distribution of the state transportation funding for Arizona. Charles Gutierrez presented a spreadsheet that can be used to prioritize the regions project list. YMPO staff encouraged the TAC to give recommendations within the next two to three weeks.

8. YMPO FY 2022 – 2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Charles Gutierrez gave a recap of the STBG FY 2022-2021TIP projects. Currently the TIP is in the public comment phase. Charles Gutierrez asked to direct all comments and questions to him. This was an informational item. No action was taken at this meeting.

9. YMPO Rail/Heavy Freight Alignment Study

We at YMPO are at another crossroads was mentioned by Mr. Charles Gutierrez. He said that the Rail Freight Study has been going back and forth a few times for the Scope of Work and in April the RFP was successfully advertised. We appreciate everyone who turned in scores for the rail study.

At this time, Mr. Gutierrez advised the Chair and TAC that we have Kimley-Horn, Brent Crowther, and Don Breazeale and Associates, Don Breazeale on the meeting and phone for any questions. Mr Gutierrez made the statement that the scores will be shown without anyone being able to see who scored what and how they ranked it only the scores.

Mr. Gutierrez displayed the ranking of member agencies submitted to the YMPO for consideration of the Rail Study. Don Breazeale and Associates and Kimley-Horn and Associates successfully submitted to the YMPO for consideration. Mr. Gutierrez displayed the scores, and Frank Sanchez made a statement to the ranking order was switched and Mr. Gutierrez said that was a mistake. It was hidden and the results were displayed with a score of 585 for Kimley-Horn and 575 for Don Breazeale.

Mr. Sanchez mentioned to the TAC that it appears the scores were very, very close, and asked Mr. Gutierrez if there were folks were not submitted. Mr. Sanchez asked should we wait two weeks to get their scores. Mr. Gutierrez said that we do not have to wait. It is solely on the TAC to move forward or wait. Mr. Ward at this time stated that San Luis and Cocopah were the ones who did not submit. Mr. Ward stated that we do not particularly need them but would be up to the TAC to decide how to mover forward. Mr. Ward said we would be happy to review these scores with members on a case-by-case basis if you feel appropriate, but in the public setting it is not appropriate for us to reveal the scores from individual jurisdictions. It was decided that the additional members that did not submit were not needed at the current time to make a recommendation to the Executive Board.

Chair asked if there is a motion to recommend the higher firm confirmed to the Executive Board and with Mr. Ward negotiating with accepted firm.

Motion by Jennifer Albers, City of Yuma, that we accept the ranking as presented by staff and direct that negotiations should pursue the recommendation to the Executive Board.

Frank Sanchez seconded the motion

Motion unanimously carried out

10. YMPO and YCIPTA Short-Range Transit Plan

Jennifer Albers had a comment regarding the bus shelters, that were stated in the financial plan for FY 20-21. Her comment was are the bus shelters still going up this fiscal year or are the shelters going up a year from now. Paul Ward addressed Jennifer Albers comment. Paul Ward stated that the shelters are funded with Federal Transit Administration funds and the funds from that program lags by one year. Even though the funds are available for 2021, the actual construction will occur until 2021 or 2022. Steve Wilks with IBI Group stated for capital purchases it is the purchase and then possibly delays in delivery and deployment or installation.

11. YMPO and ADOT.....Information and Discussion

- A. **Regional Coordination Plan for 5310-** Charles Gutierrez informed the TAC that YMPO is looking to hire a full time Mobility Manager. The Regional Coordination Plan is getting pushed back due to YMPO staff wanting the new Mobility Manager to be a part of the Coordination Plan process.
- B. Paul Ward informed the TAC that he will be moving forward with the RISE Grant for US 95. At the May 2021 YMPO Executive Board meeting Paul Ward is going to recommended that YMPO hires a consultant for this grant. The funding for the RISE Grant is for improving the next segment of US 95.
- C. **ADOT-** The next meeting and public hearing is on May 21, 2021, for the tentative 22 to 26 program. In June, the State Transportation Board will approve the 22 to 26 ADOT Construction Program. ADOT has started the next cycle P2P process to develop the 23 to 27 ADOT Construction Program.

Town of Wellton:

Same status.

Yuma County:

Avenue 28E and County 9th Street Off System Bridge Project- Waiting on the stage three 60% plans. Once received the County will review it and get comments on the 60% plans.

Avenue D/E Corridor through 18th Street – 23rd Street- The public comment period has ended. Yuma County did receive a letter from Audubon Group. The consultants are currently working on addressing that letter. The County is shooting for a final EA by late June.

Martinez Lake and Red Cloud Mine Road- The Martinez Lake portion is about 90% completed. The realignment of Red Cloud Mine has been advertised, the bid opening on June 3, 2021.

City of San Luis:

Juan Sanchez Boulevard- No update to provide.

City of Yuma:

Palo Verde & Catalina loop from 32nd Street to 4th Avenue and down to Arizona Avenue- This project is complete and can be removed from the list.

Second Avenue between 13th Street and 8th Street- Work on this project started on Monday. The duration of the project is four months. There will be intermitted closures, the contractor is working from the North to the south.

Arizona Avenue between 32nd Street and Palo Verde- This project was out to bid; the City of Yuma cancelled the bid to add additional storm drainage improvements. The design is underway, and the City anticipates releasing the project for bid the first week of June.

The City has a waterline project in the road on First Avenue between First Street and Court Street. This project will be on the agenda for Council to award. The project should be completed by the end of June.

The City has two other utility projects that are work in the road. Arizona Avenue between 10th Street and 16th Street is a waterline replacement project. The other project is a sewer line extension on 7E from 32nd Street up to 30th Street and then down 30th Street to the East adding sewer to the Yuma Commerce Center. Both projects are not anticipated to start construction until sometime in July. The projects are already out to bid.

The next project is to reconstruct North Frontage Road from 9E to 10E and to reconstruct 10E from the North Frontage Road to 28th Street. This project includes a new traffic signal at North Frontage Road and 9E. The project is being released for bid and going into purchasing today. The City of Yuma expects construction to start sometime in July or August.

City of Somerton:

Cesar Chavez Project Main Street to Jefferson- This project is delayed due to APS having to do some relocating.

Fulton Street and Council Avenue- This project is ongoing. Cemex is the contractor. Sewer infrastructure has been completed. Paving and grading is moving forward.

The City of Somerton has three waterline projects coming in. Valley Vista water main extension from Cesar Chavez to Valley Vista Complex passing Avenue G. That will be a little more that a mile of 12-inch water main.

There will also be a wastewater lift station enforcement and gravity line. This project is a half mile project that is going to serve the future high school. The project has been advertised.

The City of Somerton has another water project in the same area as the high school, it is a half mile Main to Jefferson.

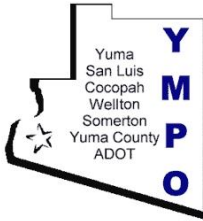

Charles Gutierrez announced that Paul Ward gained his US citizenship last month.

4. **Approval of Minutes**

This item was deferred to the next TAC meeting.

5. **Rural Regional Priority Project List**

Charles Gutierrez asked to have projects submitted by June 30, 2021.

A Regional Priority Project List is being developed at TAC for the possible priorities of the region and with the possible funding coming forth to the state for additional programming of funds. The region will need to prioritize projects in the advent of additional; funding sources come from other funding opportunities.

The TAC's homework is to submit by June 24, 2021 projects to be considered as the Regional Priority Project List in the advent the state and the region receive additional funding.

6. **Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE)**

Jeff Kramer motioned that the TAC recommends to the YMPO Executive Board that YMPO staff provides support by submitting the application for a RAISE Grant for ADOT's SR 95 Project. The support includes support letters for the City of San Luis and City of Yuma projects.

Eulogio Vera seconded.

Motion carried unanimously.

7. **FY 2020-2024 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #5**
Charles Gutierrez informed the TAC that this item was taken care of during item number 6 and the Chair can skip to item number 8.

8. **YMPO FY 2022 – 2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)**
Charles Gutierrez presented the FY 2022-2026 TIP to the TAC. The TIP will be in the public comment phase by next week. No action was taken during this meeting.

9. **Long-Range Transportation Plan Update**
Phyllis Davis with Kittelson updated the TAC on the progress of the public outreach phase. The LRTP comment period ended on May 20, 2021. Examples of the outreach activities included a dedicated phone line and email, an informational video, and ads in the local newspapers. Phyllis Davis reported that the LRTP website had 1,034 site visits, with each visit lasting an average of two minutes and 40 seconds. The online survey had 148 comments and 49 map comments. Facebook had 22,720 people engaging in the post (i.e., liked, shared, watched video, etc.).
The consultant will be reaching out to TAC members for availability to meet and discuss further on the network for each members municipality.

Southwest District up-date of on-going and up-coming construction projects
The construction activity in the Southwest District is progressing steadily. Below are some short updates of each of the On-going and up-coming projects within the District.

On-Going Projects

Interstate 8

- **I-8, Avenue 36E to MP 46 Pave. Preservation-** Project consists of pavement rehabilitation from milepost 37 to 46 on I-8. Fisher Sand & Gravel Co DBA Southwest Asphalt Paving is the prime contractor. The project is in the seeding establishment stage. Contractor is removing pole foundations and working on slope paving.
- **Yuma Regional Wrong Way Signing Project-** project consists of replacement of wrong way signs throughout the Southwest District. Project was awarded to ABBCO Sign Group, Inc. Contractor is scheduled to start work next week 7/6/21.
- **I-8, Sentinel Rest Area-** Design and construct wastewater and water repairs. Construction programmed in FY22. Project is advertised and bids will open on 9/17/21.

Interstate 10

- **I-10, Bouse Wash Rest Area Rehabilitation-** project consists of renovating buildings, rehabilitating water and wastewater systems, widening parking lots, striping, and ADA compliance. Project was awarded to Fann Contracting, Inc. Contractor is working on removal of the vending buildings, building a concrete grade, and grading a shoe-fly.

US/SR 95

- **US 95, MP 80-96 Hot Applied Chip Seal** –Project will include milling and replacing pavement in spot locations throughout the project limits and placement of chip seal. Project was awarded to Cactus Transport, Inc. Project is on hold until November 2021. Contractor will come back and complete the thermoplastic striping and placement of rumble strips.
- **Yuma Region ADA Feature Upgrades** – project consists of replacing sidewalk ramps and driveways that do not meet ADA requirements within the ADOT r/w. This project was done through a job order contract. Locations upgraded are in the Parker area. The prime contractor is K.A.Z. Construction, Inc. The contractor is working on punch list items.
- **US 95, Ave 9E-Rifle Range Road Roadway Widening-** Project consists of widening US 95 to a 5 lane section. Project was awarded to Fann Contracting , Inc. The partnering will be scheduled within the next few weeks.

US 95 & Dome Valley Road Intersection Improvement – project consists of adding left and right turn lanes at the intersection of US 95 & Dome Valley Road. Project bid opened and the apparent low bidder was Fann Contracting, Inc.

Upcoming Projects

Interstate 8

- **I-8, MP 0.1 – 31 Various Bridges Deck Rehab**– Bridge deck rehabilitation project. 95% plans will be resubmitted. Environmental clearance was issued 8/20/20. Project has been split into 2 phases due to funding restrictions. Project scheduled to advertise by January 2022.
- **I-8, Aztec to County Line (MP 71-82) Pav. Pres.**- The design kick off meeting was held. Field review meeting was held. 60% plans are scheduled to be out for review by mid July.
- **I-8, MP 134.6 – 141 Pavement Preservation**- The pre-design scoping document is being updated to include current costs. Funding authorization for design was given. PM working to get design kicked off.
- **Ave 28E @ County 9th Street (Salinity Canal) Bridge**- The project received funding approval for design in FY20 and construction in FY22. The 60% comment resolution meeting was held.

Interstate 10

- **I-10, MP 105.95-112.33 Pavement Preservation** -Project Assessment finalized. Construction funding is programmed in FY 2022. 95% comment resolution is upcoming in the next few weeks.
- **I-10, W. Quartzsite TI (Exit 17) Pre-scoping** – Pre-scoping document will be developed to identify scoping elements and construction costs for a new interchange that includes a wider bridge. Pre-scoping document complete.
- **I-10, 443rd Ave to Wintersburg Road Pav. Pres.**- project consists of pavement rehabilitation, minor safety and drainage improvements. Project Scoping cost estimate finalized. 60% plans to be submitted by Oct. 2021.
- **I-10, MP 100-105.95 Pavement Preservation**- project is part of the CRRSAA funding. Project consists of milling AR-ACFC and placing 1" bonded overlay. Project will advertise by FY 22'.
- **I-10, MP 11.70-24 Pavement Preservation** – Construction is programmed in FY23. Design scope is being finalized to get the project started.
- **I-10, Ehrenberg Rest Area Rehabilitation** – Construction is scheduled for FY25.
- **Yuma ADA Upgrade Phase 2** - project consists of removing and replacing sidewalk ramps, driveways, sidewalk to meet ADA requirements. Second phase will handle features in the Quartzsite area. Project will be advertised by spring of 2022.

US 95

US 95, Rifle Range Road- Wellton Mohawk Canal Bridge- project is under design. Project will widen to a 5 lane section with 8' shoulders through the Wellton-Mohawk Canal Bridge. Project design kick-off meeting was held. The 30% design plans and cost estimate were submitted for review and comments.

- **US 95, MP 98-104 Corridor Study**- The study will look at widening the roadway to a five lane section (2 lanes in each direction with 1 continuous left turn lane) with drainage improvements. The design kick-off meeting was held 11/6/12. Project assessment has been finalized.

Juan Sanchez Boulevard Corridor Study- The study will look at widening Juan Sanchez Boulevard to a four lane facility with concrete median separation. Environmental

clearance was issued on 11/25/19. 30% cost estimate has been updated, pavement geotechnical reports are complete. R/W funding was authorized. Will begin the process of getting a consultant on board to start the r/w process.

- **US 95, MP 44.30-54 Pavement Preservation** – Project is programmed in FY24 for construction.

US 95, Yuma Proving Ground-Cibola Lake Road Pavement Rehabilitation- project is part of the CRRSAA funding. Project consists of milling AR-ACFC and placing ACFC overlay. Project will advertise by FY22.

SR 85

- **SR 85, Warner Street Bridge-** Construction of new bridge. Project is in the 5-year program for construction in FY22.
- **SR 85, MP 142.3-148.85 Pavement Preservation** –Project Assessment has been finalized. Plans being finalized. Project to advertise by July 2021.

SR 95

- **SR 95 Colorado River Indian Tribe Sidewalk Improvement Project-** construction of 10' sidewalk pathway with lighting. Locations along Airport Road, 4th Street/SR 95, and Bluewater Resort. Pre-scoping document complete.
- **SR 95, MP 155 -161 Bonded Overlay project-** Project consists of 1" mill and replace with 1" bonded overlay. Project will advertise in FY22 .
- **SR 95, Chemehuevi Ave-Beacon Road Pavement Rehabilitation-** project is part of the CRRSAA funding. Project consists of milling AR-ACFC and placing ACFC overlay. The project will advertise by FY22.

SR 195

Ave E, SR 195 to Co. 18th Street Corridor Study- This is a Local Government project. The study will look at continuing Ave E from SR 195 intersection through to County 18th Street. Final Design Concept Report has been sent out. Working to get the environmental clearance finalized by July 2021.
