7. **Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program**

The FY27 TA call for projects opened on February 27th, 2026 and is currently underway. Applications will be accepted until April 3, 2026. ADOT will hold a TA program informational webinar on March 9th from 10:00 – 11:30am [TA Informational Webinar Link](#).

8. FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP Amendment #4

The FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP was initially approved on July 31, 2025, and has since been amended three times, most recently on January 29, 2026, by the Executive Board.

This amendment will add five new HSIP projects to the YMPO TIP and will amend one existing HSIP project.

This item is on the agenda for information, discussion, and possible action to recommend approval of the FY 2026-2030 YMPO TIP Amendment #4 to the Executive Board. Mr. Villegas will present this item; further details are contained in the information summary 8.

9. Short-Range Transit Plan RFP

YMPO applied for the 5305(e) FFY2025 Transit Planning funding, and on January 23, 2026, ADOT informed YMPO that \$180,000 in funding was approved. \$169,740 in Federal funding and \$10,260 in local match to develop a Short-Range Transit Plan (SRTP). YMPO will work closely with YCIPTA on this project, and a Request for Proposal will be released soon.

The SRTP is funded by an FTA Section 5305(e) Consolidated Planning Grant. The SRTPs should be fully updated every five years, with a planning horizon of five years (FY 2026 – FY 2030).

2. Declaration of Votes.

4. Call to the Public

5. Approval of Minutes

Approval of the January 8, 2026, TAC Meeting minutes.

MOTION: Erika Peterson, Senior Planner, City of Yuma, moved to approve the January 8, 2026, Meeting Minutes. Kelly Fricke, Public Works Director, Yuma County, seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried.

6. ADOT Presentation on Traffic Data Monitoring

Sanja Katic-Jauhar, Local Government Liaison, Nicholas Dennis, Senior GIS Analyst, and Lucas Murray, Data Analytics/HPMS Manager, ADOT's Transportation Technology Group's Traffic Monitoring, presented on Traffic Data Monitoring and Current Traffic Count Status Map.

Mrs. Katic-Jauhar emphasized the importance of collaboration with COGs and MPOs, noting that accurate and timely traffic data collection supports FHWA reporting requirements and is directly tied to continued federal funding.

She outlined the annual traffic monitoring cycle, including the seasonal break from December through February and the active count period from March through December. She encouraged agencies to share their local traffic count schedules to avoid duplication of effort.

Mr. Dennis explained that HPMS includes centerline data and more than 70 roadway attributes and emphasized the importance of Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT), which is required for federal-aid and National Highway System roads and is essential to completing portions of the HPMS report.

He reviewed Certified Public Mileage (CPM), defined as the total mileage of roads open to public travel, noting that CPM impacts federal funding allocations.

Mr. Murray discussed the upcoming Model Inventory of Roadway Events (MIRE) report, which will be submitted alongside HPMS and includes required roadway data elements, including AADT on all road types. He clarified that ADOT is responsible for submitting the MIRE report and calculating AADT estimates, though local agencies may be contacted for assistance in limited cases.

Paul Ward, Principal Engineer, YMPO, informed Mr. Murray that his presentation listed the highway performance monitoring system as a modeling system and needed to be updated.

7. Roads of Regional Significance (RORS) Update

Chris Joannes, Consultant, Kimley-Horn provided a progress update on the Roads of Regional Significance (RORS) Study. He reported that the project is in the final stages. His team organized potential environmental impacts into categories of likely impacts, no likely impacts, and those requiring additional study, and identified specific considerations related to water resources, historic routes, biological and cultural resources, and other standard environmental review areas.

Mr. Joannes requested updated information from member agencies regarding project status, completed mitigations, or acquired right-of-way to ensure the final technical memorandum and report reflect current conditions.

Feedback was requested by February 20, 2026, to support completion of the final report and preparation for approval consideration in March.

8. Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Next Round

Jeff Heinrichs, IT Manager/Associate Planner, YMPO, noted that the TA Program is a federally funded competitive grant program that supports community-based transportation alternative projects. They are funded through a set-aside of the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL).

The next call for transportation alternative projects representing the third cycle of the program is expected on February 27, 2026, but has not been announced yet.

The FY27 cycle will have \$16.9 million available for funding; \$5.85 million has been awarded to existing TA projects, leaving \$11 million available statewide for the new project funding during the upcoming call for projects.

Program updates are currently underway and are intended to streamline the application and review processes, making it easier and more efficient for communities to pursue future TA funding opportunities.

Mr. Ward noted the Yuma region represents 13% of greater Arizona and should expect approximately 1.5 million, consistent with previous funding cycles. He advised TAC members that the ADOT project website is generally reliable, but updates are not always timely, which could delay project deadlines, similar to prior experiences with the SS4A grant.

Mr. Heinrichs also informed Mr. Ward that Right-of-Way acquisitions are necessary for project submission.

Jennifer Hobert, Regional Planner, ADOT, informed TAC members ADOT received all comments that Monday and are moving forward with review and reaching out for resolutions. They hope to have the website updated with the new guidelines and the new application and scoring criteria by the end of next week.

Frank Sanchez, County Engineer, Yuma County, and Chairman Dave Wostenberg, City Engineer, City of Yuma, questioned whether they would have to continue resubmitting for each fiscal year if they did not receive the funding.

Mrs. Hobert replied that the consideration would depend on prioritization, ranking, and then availability.

9. FY2026 FTA - 5310 Regional Mobility Management Grant Opportunity

JR Aguilar, Regional Mobility Manager, YMPO informed TAC members the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) has released the FY2026 Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 funding, specifically targeting Regional Mobility Management activities conducted by Councils of Governments (COGs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) across Arizona.

Mr. Aguilar encouraged all TAC members to share any identified mobility gaps and noted that YMPO offers a Travel Training Program that could be beneficial to individuals with disabilities.

Chairman Wostenberg questioned whether the bus stop on 32nd Street and Avenue 8E, which is missing pavement, could request this funding.

Mr. Aguilar noted it will depend on the match with potential funding sources, including the TA program. The Short-Range Transit Plan, being developed in coordination with WACOG and Yuma County Intergovernmental Public Transportation Authority (YCIPTA), will also identify mobility needs, such as bike and pedestrian access to transit routes.

Susan Cowey, CIP Administrator, City of Yuma, suggested Mr. Aguilar join City of Yuma's Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Commission to gain more information on where mobility gaps may be present.

Mr. Villegas added that the Complete Streets Concept Study (CSCS) included a focus on the Yuma County regional bus pull-out needs and could serve as a reference point when submitting applications.

10. Fortuna Railroad Crossing Resolution/Letter of Support

Mr. Ward recalled that during the Executive Board meeting on January 29, 2026, he announced that Yuma County had approved a Resolution requesting Union Pacific to invest in permanent repairs to the signal wiring and infrastructure at the railroad crossing located on Fortuna Road. The YMPO Executive Board authorized YMPO staff to draft a Resolution supporting the County's Resolution for approval by the Executive Board during YMPO's February meeting.

A draft Letter of Support was written and sent to Union Pacific, and a draft Resolution of Support is attached to the Information Summary for this item for review, comment, and possible recommendation to the Executive Board.

Mr. Sanchez noted that this railroad crossing has been an ongoing issue with multiple attempts to have Pacific Railroad repair it. Mr. Ward shared that the Arizona Corporation Commission posts a direct support number somewhere in the vicinity of the railroad. He encouraged TAC members to inform others of this line and call the number if they experienced issues with the railroad firsthand.

MOTION: Mr. Sanchez moved to recommend approval of the Resolution requesting repairs to the infrastructure at the Fortuna Road Railroad Crossing and a letter of support to the Executive Board. Mrs. Cowey seconded the motion, which was unanimously carried.



SUBJECT: The Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program

SUMMARY:

The Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program is a federally funded program that supports community-based projects that focus on improving safety, connectivity, and quality of life while reducing reliance on motor vehicles.

The Transportation Alternatives program is being operated as a competitive-grant program that is funded through a set-aside of the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. Example projects that are eligible for TA funding are multi-use pathways, Safe Routes to School projects, historic preservation and safety assessments just to name a few.

The FY27 TA call for projects began on February 27, 2026, with applications being accepted through April 3, 2026. ADOT is holding a TA program information webinar on March 9, 2026 ([TA Program Informational Webinar](#)), to go over changes and review the new TA application. Tribal governments, transit agencies, school districts and non-profit organizations need to pull together project documentation, community support evidence and mini-DCRs for submittal. More information and the TA guidebook are available at the Transportation Alternatives website at www.azdot.gov/TA.

For this FY27 cycle, there will be \$16.9M available for Greater Arizona with \$5.85M already awarded to projects from the previous TA cycle(s). The remaining \$11.1M for FY27 is available for new project funding across fiscal years FY27/28/29.

Locally, two TA projects have advanced from the FY26 funding cycle:

- Yuma County's East Main Canal Multi-Use Pathway from County 12th to 14th Streets, was awarded \$183,885 in FY26 TA funding for project scoping activities.
- City of Yuma Shared-Use Pathway along Avenue 6E from 32nd to 36th Streets ending at the new East Mesa Community Park, was awarded \$424,350 in TA design funds for FY27 and \$1.2M in FY29 TA funding for construction.

The scope of work for the US-95 Raised Median construction project in San Luis changed from County 20 ½ St to County 21st Street in FY 2026. The project is now only one mile long.
